Communication

E1. When your child wants something, does she tell you by pointing to it?

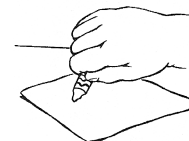

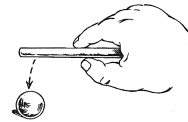

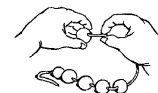

E36. After a crumb or Cheerio is dropped into a bottle, does your child purposely turn the bottle over to dump it out?

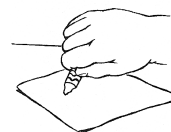
- You may show him how to do this.

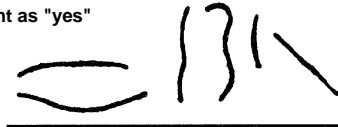

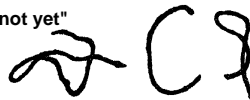
Scribbling back and forth does not count as "yes".

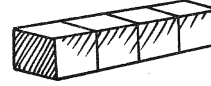

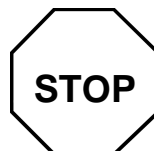
